

Summary Public Assessment Report

This is a summary of the public assessment report (PAR) for Bulgaplin. It explains how the assessment was made and why the authorisation was recommended as well as the conditions of use. It is not intended to provide practical advice on how to use the product.

For practical information about the use of the product, patients should read the package leaflet or contact their doctor or pharmacist.

What is Bulgaplin and what is it used for?

The product is a 'generic medicine'. This means that it is similar to a 'reference medicine' already authorised in the European Union (EU) called Lyrica.

The product is used in the treatment of epilepsy, long lasting pain caused by damage to the nerves (peripheral and central neuropathic pain), and Generalised Anxiety Disorder (GAD; prolonged excessive anxiety and worry).

How does Bulgaplin work?

The active substance pregabalin binds to an ancillary protein subunit of the, so called, 'voltage-gated calcium channels' located on the surface of nerve cells of the central nervous system.

How is Bulgaplin used?

The pharmaceutical form is capsule, hard for oral use.

Please read section 3 of the package leaflet for detailed information on dosing recommendations, the route of administration, and the duration of treatment.

The medicine can only be obtained with a prescription in Sweden.

What benefits of Bulgaplin have been shown in studies?

Because the product is a generic medicine, studies in patients have been limited to tests to determine that it is bioequivalent to the reference medicine, Lyrica. Two medicines are bioequivalent when they produce the same levels of the active substance in the body.

What are the possible side effects from Bulgaplin?

Because the product is a generic medicine, its benefits and possible side effects are taken as being the same as the reference medicine.

Why is Bulgaplin approved?

It was concluded that, in accordance with EU requirements, the product has been shown to have comparable quality and is considered to be bioequivalent to the reference medicine. Therefore, the Swedish Medical Products Agency decided that, as for Lyrica, the benefits are greater than its risks and recommended that it can be approved for use.

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What measures are being taken to ensure the safe and effective use of Bulgaplin?

A risk management plan has been developed to ensure that the product is used as safely as possible. Based on this plan, safety information has been included in the summary of product characteristics and the package leaflet, including the appropriate precautions to be followed by healthcare professionals and patients.

Known side effects are continuously monitored. Furthermore, new safety signals reported by patients/healthcare professionals will be monitored/reviewed continuously as well.
