

Summary Public Assessment Report

Lansoprazole SUN Pharma (lansoprazole)

Orodispersible tablet, 15 mg, 30 mg

This is a summary of the public assessment report (PAR) for Lansoprazole SUN Pharma. It explains how the assessment was made and why the authorisation was recommended as well as the conditions of use. It is not intended to provide practical advice on how to use the product.

For practical information about the use of the product, patients should read the package leaflet or contact their doctor or pharmacist.

What is Lansoprazole SUN Pharma and what is it used for?

The product is a 'generic medicine'. This means that it is similar to a 'reference medicine' already authorised in the European Union (EU) called Lanzo.

The product may be prescribed for the following indications:

- Treatment of duodenal and stomach ulcer
- Treatment of inflammation in your oesophagus (reflux oesophagitis)
- Prevention of reflux oesophagitis
- Treatment of heartburn and acid regurgitation
- Treatment of infections caused by the bacteria *Helicobacter pylori* when given in combination with antibiotic therapy
- Treatment or prevention of duodenal or stomach ulcer in patients requiring continued non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAID) treatment (NSAID treatment is used against pain or inflammation)
- Treatment of Zollinger-Ellison syndrome.

How does Lansoprazole SUN Pharma work?

The active ingredient in {(Invented) name} is lansoprazole, which is a proton pump inhibitor. Proton pump inhibitors reduce the amount of acid that your stomach makes.

How is Lansoprazole SUN Pharma used?

The pharmaceutical form is orodispersible tablet for oral use.

Please read section 3 of the package leaflet for detailed information on dosing recommendations, the route of administration, and the duration of treatment.

The medicine can only be obtained with a prescription in Sweden.

What benefits of Lansoprazole SUN Pharma have been shown in studies?

Because the product is a generic medicine, studies in patients have been limited to tests to determine that it is bioequivalent to the reference medicine, Lanzo. Two medicines are bioequivalent when they produce the same levels of the active substance in the body.

What are the possible side effects from Lansoprazole SUN Pharma?

Because the product is a generic medicine, its benefits and possible side effects are taken as being the same as the reference medicine.

Why is Lansoprazole SUN Pharma approved?

It was concluded that, in accordance with EU requirements, the product has been shown to have comparable quality and is considered to be bioequivalent to the reference medicine. Therefore, the Swedish Medical Products Agency decided that, as for Lanzo, the benefits are greater than its risks and recommended that it can be approved for use.

What measures are being taken to ensure the safe and effective use of Lansoprazole SUN Pharma?

A risk management plan has been developed to ensure that the product is used as safely as possible. Based on this plan, safety information has been included in the summary of product characteristics and the package leaflet, including the appropriate precautions to be followed by healthcare professionals and patients.

Known side effects are continuously monitored. Furthermore, new safety signals reported by patients/healthcare professionals will be monitored/reviewed continuously as well.
