

Summary Public Assessment Report

This is a summary of the public assessment report (PAR) for Teriflunomid SUN. It explains how the assessment was made and why the authorisation was recommended as well as the conditions of use. It is not intended to provide practical advice on how to use the product.

For practical information about the use of the product, patients should read the package leaflet or contact their doctor or pharmacist.

What is Teriflunomid SUN and what is it used for?

The product is a 'generic medicine'. This means that it is similar to a 'reference medicine' already authorised in the European Union (EU) called Aubagio.

Teriflunomid SUN contains the active substance teriflunomide which is an immunomodulatory agent and adjusts the immune system to limit its attack on the nervous system.

It is used in adults and in children and adolescents (10 years of age and older) to treat relapsing remitting multiple sclerosis (MS).

How does Teriflunomid SUN work?

Teriflunomid SUN helps to protect against attacks on the central nervous system by the immune system by limiting the increase of some white blood cells (lymphocytes). This limits the inflammation that leads to nerve damage in MS.

How is Teriflunomid SUN used?

The pharmaceutical form is film-coated tablet for oral use.

Please read section 3 of the package leaflet for detailed information on dosing recommendations, the route of administration, and the duration of treatment.

The medicine can only be obtained with a prescription in Sweden.

What benefits of Teriflunomid SUN have been shown in studies?

Because the product is a generic medicine, studies have been limited to tests to determine that it is bioequivalent to the reference medicine, Aubagio. Two medicines are bioequivalent when they produce the same levels of the active substance in the body.

What are the possible side effects from Teriflunomid SUN?

Because the product is a generic medicine, its benefits and possible side effects are taken as being the same as the reference medicine.

Why is Teriflunomid SUN approved?

It was concluded that, in accordance with EU requirements, the product has been shown to have comparable quality and is bioequivalent to the reference medicine. Therefore, the Swedish Medical

Products Agency decided that, as for Aubagio, the benefits are greater than its risks and recommended that it can be approved for use.

What measures are being taken to ensure the safe and effective use of Teriflunomid SUN?

A risk management plan has been developed to ensure that the product is used as safely as possible. Based on this plan, safety information has been included in the summary of product characteristics and the package leaflet, including the appropriate precautions to be followed by healthcare professionals and patients.
